SECTION 1

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus that Section 127-58B - "Designation of Locations at or Near Private Residences" shall be amended by <u>deleting</u> the following locations:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS, COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-2

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A PERMANENT UTILITY EASEMENT TO NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ON BLOCK 132, LOT 3

WHEREAS, the Town of Secaucus is the owner of certain property located within the Town of Secaucus identified as Block 132, Lot 3 on Tax Maps and Parcel UE112A consisting of approximately 100 square feet as depicted on the attached map prepared for the New Jersey Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, at the request of the New Jersey Department of Transportation, the Town of Secaucus wishes to grant to the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) a permanent easement on the above property for the construction, maintenance and repair of utility pole guy wires and guy anchor above and below ground appurtenances; and

WHEREAS, acceptance of the conveyance of said real property requires the approval by Ordinance of the Town Council pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:12-5; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the public to provide said utility easement.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, County of Hudson, State of New Jersey:

- 1. The Town of Secaucus hereby accepts the dedication of a permanent utility easement on Block 132, Lot 3 for the construction, maintenance and repair of utility pole guy wires and guy anchor above and below ground appurtenances.
- 2. The Mayor, Town Administrator and the Town's Counsel are hereby authorized to execute the easement document(s) necessary for the construction, maintenance and repair of utility pole guy wires and guy anchor above and below ground appurtenances on the property more particularly described as Block 132, Lot 3 on Secaucus Tax Maps and as Parcel UE112A, consisting of approximately 100 square feet, as depicted on the attached map prepared for the New Jersey Department of Transportation.
- 3. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- 4. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to that section, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be valid and effective.
- 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication in accordance with law.

Parcel UE112A, at about Station 18+30, (Baseline Paterson Plank Road Stationing), consisting of the permanent right to construct, maintain and repair utility pole guy wires and guy anchor above and below ground and appurtenances as far as the line marked "Utility Easement Line", as shown on the aforesaid maps";

Being also known as an easement in Lot 3 in Block 132 on the tax map of the Town of Secaucus, Hudson County;

Parcel E112B, at about station 18+50 (Baseline Paterson Plank Road stationing), consisting of the temporary right to enter upon the remaining lands of the owner or assigns with personnel and equipment for the purpose of constructing sidewalk, driveway and apputenances, and also to construct, operate and maintain temporary utility poles and aerial facilities and to close temporarily the northerly property driveway as far as the line marked "Temporary Construction Easement Line", as shown on the aforesaid maps. This temporary right shall begin from the date of notice from the State's Resident Engineer, and shall terminate upon completion of said work, which shall be for a duration of seven months. If the State, within its sole discretion, determines that the temporary easement or right needs to be extended in order to complete the Work, such right may be extended simply by written notice from the Resident Engineer to the owner or its assigns. In such event that this temporary right is extended, payment will be made semi-annually during the extended term of the temporary right, based upon the 'per-monthly' rate set forth in the State's offer letter;



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ORDINANCE NO. 2018-4

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 127 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" TO UPDATE PARKING METER LOCATIONS AND LIMITS ON GOLDEN AVENUE

WHEREAS, the Town has previously adopted an Ordinance specifying locations, fees and time limits for all parking meters in the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that a change to Article XIII of Chapter 127 of the Code of the Town of Secaucus to set certain time limits to meter spaces in the Plaza Center based upon the parking needs for businesses in that vicinity to allow customer access and turnover; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, County of Hudson, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. Chapter 127 entitled "Vehicles and Traffic," Article XIII entitled "Parking Meters," §127-49 et seq. of the Code of the Town of Secaucus be, and is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows: (deletions are indicated by eross-outs; additions are indicated in **bold**):

§ 127-55. Parking meter zones and time limits.

ORDINANCE NO. 2018-5

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 127 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS ENTITLED "VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC" TO ADD A PARKING LOCATION WHERE TIME IS RESTRICTED

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council recognize that the safety of all motorists, passengers, pedestrians, children, residents and visitors is of utmost importance; and

WHEREAS, the Town enacted §127-1 et seq. to assist in alleviating dangerous situations on the Town's streets, promote safe passage, address traffic flow, and specify penalties for violations; and

WHEREAS, upon the review and recommendation of the Secaucus Police Department Traffic Division, the Mayor and Council have determined an update is needed to designate a short-term parking spot in the vicinity of a local business at 1620 Paterson Plank Road, which is in a high residential and traffic area to aid in resident and public safety and decrease parking congestion for residents, business owners and the general public.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, County of Hudson, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The following changes shall be made to §127-26 "Schedule IV: Time Limit Parking Certain Days" of the Code of the Town of Secaucus and additions of locations shall be deemed time limited parking areas under § 127-10. Chapter 127 be, and is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows: (additions are indicated in **bold**):

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus that Section 127-58B - "Designation of Locations at or Near Private Residences" shall be amended by adding the following location:

That the parking space designated for 310 Clarendon Street adopted by Ordinance is to be personalized for Placard P1748604.

If the license plate for the persons utilizing the parking spaces at the above listed address changes, then the parking space designation shall be changed to the new plate with proof from the resident that it is for the same person that the person is still entitled to handicapped parking.

It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part had not been included therein, and if such persons or circumstances, to which the ordinance or part thereof is held inapplicable, had been specifically exempted therefrom. <u>SECTION 3</u>

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 28 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS ENTITLED "POLICE DEPARTMENT" TO UPDATE QUALIFICATIONS, CLASSIFICATIONS AND PROCEDURES FOR APPOINTMENTS

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that changes to the Ordinance entitled "Police Department" shall be made based upon the review and recommendation of the Secaucus Police Department.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, County of Hudson, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1.

Chapter 28 entitled "Police Department," "§28-7. Qualifications for appointments; testing, fees." of the Code of the Town of Secaucus be, and is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows: (additions are indicated in **bold**, deletions indicated by strikethroughs):

B. All applicants for appointment shall pay a one hundred twenty-five dollar (\$125.00) one hundred forty-five dollars (\$145.00) fee for the competitive testing which consists of written, psychological and medical examinations, to defray the administrative costs of such examinations.

Chapter 28 entitled "Police Department," "§28-7.1. Classification of qualified applicants." of the Code of the Town of Secaucus be, and is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows: (additions are indicated in **bold**, deletions indicated by strikethroughs):

§ 28-7.1. Classification of qualified applicants.

- A. All **initial** appointments to the position of police officer shall be made in accordance with the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-123.1a.
- B. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:14-123.1a, preference shall be given to persons who are residents of the Town of Secaucus as of the announced test application closing date for the position and who maintain-such residency continuously up to and including the date of appointment. Before any person shall be appointed as a member of the Secaucus Police Department, the Town shall classify all duly qualified applicants for the position or positions to be filled in the following classes:
 - I. Residents of the Town of Secaucus, New Jersey.
 - **II.** Other residents of the County of Hudson, New Jersey.
 - III. Other residents of the State of New Jersey.
 - IV. All other qualified applicants.

- C. Within each classification, qualified applicants who meet the minimum scoring requirement who are veterans in accordance with the definitions set forth in <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 11A:5-1 shall have five (5) additional points added to their total score and shall be ranked accordingly. Aside from the purpose of defining veteran and disabled veteran, it is not the intention of this Chapter to incorporate any other provisions of Chapter 11A, unless specifically referenced herein. Any applicant that would qualify as a veteran pursuant to N.J.S.A. 11A:5-1 after meeting the qualification outlined in this section as well as the minimum scoring requirement listed in Section 28-8 shall have five (5) additional points added to their total score and shall be ranked accordingly.
- D. The classes of duly qualified applicants defined in this section shall be considered separate and successive lists. The Mayor and Council shall first appoint all those in Class I, and then those in each succeeding class in the order above listed. The Mayor and Council shall appoint a person or persons in any such class only to a vacancy or vacancies remaining after all qualified applicants in the preceding class or classes have been appointed or have declined an offer of appointment.
- E. For classification in Class I as a resident of the Town of Secaucus, an applicant must reside within the Town of Secaucus as of the announced test application closing date for the position and maintain such residency continuously up to and including the date of appointment. Should an applicant in Class I discontinue their residency, said applicant will be subject to removal from that class of the eligibility list and shall be placed in the appropriate class in order of their respective scores.
- F. Should an applicant in Class II or III discontinue their residency prior to or on the date of appointment, said applicant will be subject to removal from that class of the eligibility list and shall be placed in the appropriate class in order of their respective scores.

Chapter 28 entitled "Police Department," "§28-8. Procedures for appointment." of the Code of the Town of Secaucus be, and is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows: (additions are indicated in **bold**, deletions indicated by strikethroughs):

A. Applications for appointment to the Police Department shall be made in writing and signed by the person by whom it is made on a form and in a manner approved by the Town Administrator. When the Council from time to time determines to fill vacancies, applicants meeting the requirements of Section 28-7 hereof shall be provided with a written examination, with a necessary passing grade of seventy percent (70%). If successful, then a physical fitness examination shall be completed, with a passing score necessary for all events. Then, if successful, an oral examination with a passing grade of seventy percent (70%) is needed. Eligible Class I and Class II applicants will first be offered the opportunity to take the oral examination, if all other requirements are met. The remaining applicant classes shall be offered the opportunity to take the oral examination after Class I and Class II applicants are exhausted for appointments. In the event of a tie of the final tabulated score based on the above, the applicant successfully passes all the testing components described above, a Police Department background investigation shall be completed. The names of all applicants who pass the aforementioned procedures for appointment

shall be brought before the Mayor and Council for consideration for appointment and ranked based upon test results and Section 28-7.1 above. Once given a conditional offer of employment, an applicant must also successfully complete a psychological and medical fitness evaluation for service as a police officer. The testing agencies and physicians shall be those designated by the Town Administrator and approved by the Mayor and Council.

- 4. There are no other changes to this Chapter of the Code of the Town of Secaucus.
- 5. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that a replacement of Chapter 23 of The Code of the Town of Secaucus is warranted based upon a need for an update of the Code to bring it conformity with chapters 9 and 62 of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, County of Hudson, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. Chapter 23 entitled "Officers and Employees," of the Code of the Town of Secaucus be, and is hereby repealed in its entirety and replaced to read as follows:

<u>Article I</u>

Principal Municipal Officers and Managerial Executive Employees, Confidential Employees, and or Exempt Employees as Defined by <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 34:13A-3 et. seq.

Subsection 1.

Town Administrator

§ 23-1 Creation of Office.

Pursuant to the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:9-136 et seq., there is hereby created in the Town of Secaucus the Office of Town Administrator.

§ 23-2 Powers and Duties.

The Town Administrator shall administer the executive responsibilities and business affairs of the Town of Secaucus. The Town Administrator shall have such administrative powers and perform such duties other than those required by law to be exercised by the governing body itself, or by another officer, board or body.

The Town Administrator shall, also be known as the Equal Employment Opportunity Officer of the Town of Secaucus, who shall oversee the Town's compliance with all laws, rules, regulations, and consent decrees entered into by the Town with respect to equal opportunity, including but not limited to record keeping with respect to the same, and establishing such procedures as are necessary to meet this responsibility.

§23-3 Term of Office.

The term of office of the Town Administrator shall be at the pleasure of the governing body.

§23-4 Appointment.

The Town Administrator shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-5 Removal from Office.

The Town Administrator may be removed by a two thirds (2/3) vote of the governing body. The resolution shall become effective three (3) months after its adoption, unless the governing body provides that its removal resolution has immediate effect. If a removal resolution shall have immediate effect, the governing body shall cause to be paid to the Town Administrator forthwith any unpaid balance of his salary and his salary for the next three (3) calendar months following the adoption of the resolution.

§23-6 Salary.

The salary of the Town Administrator shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 2.

Town Attorney

§23-7 Creation of Office.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:9-139, there is hereby created the Office of the Town Attorney.

§23-8 Appointment.

The Town Attorney shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-9 Term of Office.

The term of office of the Town Attorney shall be for one (1) year.

§23-10 Duties.

The Town Attorney shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-11 Compensation.

The salary of the Town Attorney shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 3.

Town Engineer

§23-12 Creation of Office.

Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:9-140, there is hereby created the office of Town Engineer of the Town of Secaucus.

§23-13 Appointment, Term of Office.

The Town Engineer shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council for a term of three (3) years.

§23-14 Qualifications.

The Town Engineer shall be a duly qualified licensed engineer authorized by the laws of this state to practice his profession in the State of New Jersey.

§23-15 Duties.

The Town Engineer shall perform and supervise town engineering work whenever such engineering services are requested by the Mayor and Council and/or Town Administrator. The Town Engineer shall review such files and give recommendations as required by the Secaucus Board of Adjustment and the Secaucus Planning. The Town Engineer shall, at the request of the Mayor and Council, attend meetings of said body, and of any body or agency or board of the Town of Secaucus, give general engineering advice and represent the Town generally in technical matters that may require the services of an engineer.

§23-16 Compensation.

The salary of the Town Engineer shall be set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 4.

Chief Financial Officer

§23-17 Creation of Office, Term of Office, Appointment.

There shall be the position of Chief Financial Officer, in accordance with <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:9-140.1 et seq. which term of office shall be for four (4) years, which shall run from January 1^{st} of the year in which the Chief Financial Officer is appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-18 Qualifications.

The Chief Financial Officer shall be certified as a Municipal Financial Officer pursuant to Chapter 110 of the Law of New Jersey 1988, and hold a Municipal Financial Officer's Certificate issued by the State of New Jersey. The Chief Financial Officer shall meet and continue to meet all state qualifications and renew certificates as required.

§23-19 Duties.

The Chief Financial Officer shall perform such duties as may be assigned by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-20 Compensation.

The salary of the Chief Financial Officer shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 5.

Town Clerk

§23-21 Creation of Office, Appointment, Term of Office, Duties.

There is hereby created the position of Town Clerk in accordance with <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:9-133 et. seq. and the term of office will be in accordance with same. The Town Clerk shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

The Town Clerk shall perform all duties required of the office as required by law. In addition to the statutory duties, the Town Clerk shall perform such duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-22 Compensation.

The salary of the Town Clerk shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 6.

Tax Collector

§23-23 Creation of Office, Appointment, Term of Office.

Pursuant to the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:9-141 et seq., there is hereby created the office Town Tax Collector. The office of Town Tax Collector shall be filled by appointment as provided by law. The term of the Tax Collector shall be three (3) years from the first day of January next following the Tax Collector's appointment.

§23-24 Duties.

The Town Tax Collector, in addition to the statutory duties, shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-25 Compensation.

The salary of the Town Tax Collector shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 7.

Tax Assessor

§23-26 Creation of Office, Appointment, Term of Office.

There is hereby created and established the office of Assessor of Taxes pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:9-146 and 40A:9-148. The Assessor of Taxes shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council and shall hold office for a term as provided by law.

§23-27 Duties.

The Town Tax Assessor, in addition to the statutory duties, shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-28 Compensation.

The salary of the Assessor of Taxes shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 8.

Deputy Town Clerk

§23-29 Creation of Position.

Pursuant to the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:0-135 et seq., there is hereby created the position of Deputy Town Clerk.

§23-30 Appointment, Term of Office.

The Deputy Town Clerk shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council. The Deputy Town Clerk shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year to commence on the first day of January of each year.

§23-31 Duties.

The Deputy Town Clerk shall perform such duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Town Clerk, the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator. During the absence or disability of the Town Clerk, the Deputy Town Clerk shall have all the powers of the Town Clerk and shall perform the functions and duties of such office.

§23-32 Compensation.

The salary of the Deputy Town Clerk shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 9.

Director of Human Resources

§23-33 Creation, Appointment.

There is hereby created the position of Director of Human Resources. The Director of Human Resources shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-34 Term of Office.

The term of office of the Director of Human Resources shall be at the pleasure of the Mayor and Counsel.

§23-35 Duties.

The Director of Human Resources shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council, the Town Administrator and/or the Town Attorney.

§23-36 Compensation.

The salary of the Director of Human Resources shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 10.

Superintendent, Public Works

§23-37 Creation, Appointment.

Pursuant to the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A: 9-145.5 et seq. there is hereby created the position of Superintendent of Public Works. The Superintendent of Public Works shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-38 Term of Office.

The term of office of the Superintendent of Public Works shall be for one (1) year.

§23-39 Duties.

The Superintendent of Public Works shall perform such duties as mandated by statute and additional duties as may be assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-40 Compensation.

The salary of the Superintendent of Public Works shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 11.

Construction Code Official

§23-41 Creation, Appointment. Pursuant to the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:55D-1 et seq., there is hereby created the position of Construction Code Official. The Construction Code Official shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-42 Term of Office. The term of office of the Construction Code Official shall be for one (1) year.

§23-43 Duties. The Construction Code Official shall serve as the Director of the Office of the Division of Inspections and perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-44 Compensation. The salary of the Construction Code Official shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 12.

Director of Social Services and Public Welfare

§23-45 Creation, Appointment. There is hereby created the position of Director of Social Services and Public Welfare. The Director of Social Services and Public Welfare shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-46 Term of Office. The term of office of the Director of Social Services and Public Welfare shall be for one (1) year.

§23-47 Duties. The Director of Social Services and Public Welfare shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-48 Compensation. The salary of the Director of Social Services and Public Welfare shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 13.

Superintendent of Recreation

§23-49 Creation, Appointment. There is hereby created the position of Superintendent of Recreation. The Superintendent of Recreation shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-50 Term of Office. The term of office of the Superintendent of Recreation shall be for one (1) year.

§23-51 Duties. The Superintendent of Recreation shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-52 Compensation. The salary of the Superintendent of Recreation shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 14.

Purchasing Agent

§23-53 Creation, Appointment. Pursuant to the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:9-30 et seq. there is hereby created the position of Purchasing Agent. The Purchasing Agent shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-54 Term of Office. The term of office of the Purchasing Agent shall be in accordance with <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:9-30.

§23-55 Duties. In addition to the statutory duties of the office, the Purchasing Agent shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council, the Town Administrator and/or the Town Chief Financial Officer.

§23-56 Compensation. The salary of the Purchasing Agent shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 15.

Employee Benefits Coordinator

§23-57 Creation, Appointment. There is hereby created the position of Employee Benefits Coordinator. The Employee Benefits Coordinator shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-58 Term of Office. The term of office of the Employee Benefits Coordinator shall be at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-59 Duties. The Employee Benefits Coordinator shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-60 Compensation. The salary of the Employee Benefits Coordinator shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 16.

Administrative Assistant to the Mayor

§23-61 Creation, Appointment. There is hereby created the position of Administrative Assistant to the Mayor. The Administrative Assistant to the Mayor shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-62 Term of Office. The Administrative Assistant to the Mayor shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-63 Duties. The Administrative Assistant to the Mayor shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-64 Compensation. The salary of the Administrative Assistant to the Mayor shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 17.

Administrative Assistant to the Town Administrator

§23-65 Creation, Appointment. There is hereby created the position of Administrative Assistant to the Town Administrator. The Administrative Assistant to the Town Administrator shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-66 Term of Office. The Administrative Assistant to the Town Administrator shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-67 Duties. The Administrative Assistant to the Town Administrator shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-68 Compensation. The salary of the Administrative Assistant to the Town Administrator shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 18.

Administrative Assistant to the Town Attorney

§23-69 Creation, Appointment. There is hereby created the position of Administrative Assistant to the Town Attorney. The Administrative Assistant to the Town Attorney shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-70 Term of Office. The Administrative Assistant to the Town Attorney shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-71 Duties. The Administrative Assistant to the Town Attorney shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council, Town Attorney and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-72 Compensation. The salary of the Administrative Assistant to the Town Attorney shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 19.

Grant Coordinator

§23-73 Creation, Appointment. There is hereby created the position of Grant Coordinator. The Grant Coordinator shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-74 Term of Office. The Grant Coordinator shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-75 Duties. The Grant Coordinator shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council, the Town Administrator and/or the Chief Financial Officer.

§23-76 Compensation. The salary of the Grant Coordinator shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 20

Director of Information Technology

§23-77 Creation, Appointment, Term of Office. There is hereby created the position of Director of Information Technology. The Director of Information Technology shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council. The term of office of the Director of Information Technology shall be for one (1) year.

§23-78 Duties. The duties of the Director of Information Technology shall be as assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council and/or the Town Administrator.

§23-79 Compensation. The Salary of the Director of Information Technology shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Article II Employees

Subsection 1.

Court Administrator

§23-80 Creation. Pursuant to the provisions of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 2B:12-10 et seq., there is hereby created the position of Court Administrator.

§23-81 Appointment. The Court Administrator shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council and subject to the terms of <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 2B:12-10 et seq.

§23-82 Term of Office. The Court Administrator shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-83 Duties. The Court Administrator shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Judge of the Municipal Court.

§23-84 Compensation. The salary of the Court Administrator shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 2.

Deputy Court Administrator

§23-85 Creation. There is hereby created the position of Deputy Court Administrator.

§23-86 Appointment. The Deputy Court Administrator shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council.

§23-87 Term of Office. The Deputy Court Administrator shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-88 Duties. The Deputy Court Administrator shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Judge of the Municipal Court and/or the Court Administrator.

§23-89 Compensation. The salary of the Deputy Court Administrator shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 3.

Administrative Clerk

§23-90 Creation. There is hereby created the position of Administrative Clerk.

§23-91 Appointment, Term of Office. The Mayor and Council shall appoint, from time to time, as many Administrative Clerks as deemed necessary. The Administrative Clerks' term of office shall be at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-92 Duties. The Administrative Clerks shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council, Town Administrator, and/or the appropriate supervisor to which the Clerk is assigned.

§23-93 Compensation. The salary of Administrative Clerks shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Administrative Assistant

§23-94 Creation. There is hereby created the position of Administrative Assistant.

§23-95 Appointment, Term of Office. The Mayor and Council shall appoint, from time to time, as many Administrative Assistants as deemed necessary. The Administrative Assistants' term of office shall be at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-103 Duties. The Custodians shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council, Town Administrator, and/or the appropriate supervisor to which the Custodian is assigned.

§23-110 Appointment, Term of Office. The Mayor and Council shall appoint, from time to time, as many Parking Enforcement Officers as deemed necessary. The Parking Enforcement Officers' term of office shall be at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-111 Duties. The Parking Enforcement Officers shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Chief of Police or designee and or the Town Administrator.

§23-112 Compensation. The salary of Parking Enforcement Officers shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance or paid by voucher.

Project Manager

§23-114 Appointment, Term of Office. The Project Manager shall be appointed by the Mayor and Council. The term of office of the Project Manager shall be at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-115 Duties. The Project Manager shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council, the Town Administrator, and/or the Superintendent of the Department of Public Works.

§23-116 Compensation. The salary of the Project Manager shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

Subsection 10.

Foreperson

§23-117 Creation. There is hereby created the position of Foreperson.

§23-118 Appointment, Term of Office. The Mayor and Council shall appoint, from time to time, as many Forepersons as deemed necessary. The Forepersons' term of office shall be at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§23-119 Duties. The Forepersons shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council, Town Administrator, Superintendent/Assistant Superintendent, and/or any other appropriate supervisor to which the Foreperson is assigned.

§23-127 Duties. The Interlocal Carpenter shall perform such duties as are assigned from time to time by the Mayor and Council, Town Administrator, and/or Superintendent of the Department of Public Works.

§23-128 Compensation. The salary of the Interlocal Carpenter shall be as set forth in the annual Salary Ordinance.

§23-146 Appointment, Term of Office. The Mayor and Council shall appoint, from time to time, as many Assistant Mechanics as deemed necessary. The Assistant Mechanics' term of office shall be at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

Except as hereinafter provided, the Town of Secaucus, hereinafter known as the "town" shall, upon request of any present or former official, employee or appointee of the town provide for indemnification and legal defense of any civil action brought against said person or persons arising from an act or omission falling within the scope of their public duties.

B. Pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 59:10-4, the indemnification and defense provided for in this Article shall include exemplary or punitive damages resulting from the employee's civil violation of state or federal law it, in the opinion of the Mayor and Council the acts committed upon which the damages are based did not constitute actual fraud, actual malice, willful misconduct or an intentional wrong.

C. The terms of this Article and the definition of official, employee and appointees are to be construed liberally in order to effectuate the purposes of this article except that these terms shall not mean a) any person who is not a natural person; b) any person while providing goods or services of any kind under any contract with the town except an employment contract; c) any person while providing legal or engineering services for compensation unless said person is a full-time employee of the town; and d) any person who as a condition of his or her contract is required to indemnify and defend the town and/or secure insurance.

2. This Chapter of the Code of the Town of Secaucus should be read in Conjunction with other relevant Chapters of the Code; and when applicable, with appropriate Collective

Bargaining Agreements. When other Ordinances and parts of Ordinances are inconsistent herewith this Chapter is controlling.

3. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to that section, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be valid and effective.

4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication in accordance with law.

WHEREAS, the Town of Secaucus currently utilizes Cognito LLC and Stripe, Inc. to accept online payments and to provide credit card processing services as approved by the Town's Chief Financial Officer, Nicholas Goldsack; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Mayor and Town Council to authorize the payment of fire inspections and registrations through the Fire Prevention Department by credit card, in addition to the traditional methods of check or cash in the interest of resident ease.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, in the County of Hudson and the State of New Jersey as follows:

- 1. That the Town Council authorizes the Fire Prevention Department to accept credit card payments for the payment of fire inspections and registrations. The types of credit cards accepted are Visa, Mastercard, American Express, Discover, JCB and Diners Club credit and debit cards. Credit card payments will be accepted online.
- 2. That the use of credit cards for payment is subject to the provisions of <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:30-9.1 *et seq.* and Local Finance Notice # CFO-97-2.
- 3. In accordance with <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:30-9.9, the convenience transaction fees associated with the handling and processing of credit cards will be charged to the Payor at the time the transaction occurs and shall be itemized on the receipt.


