WHEREAS, distracted driving can result in injuries and deaths to all road users (motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists); and

WHEREAS, distracted driving occurs when drivers divert their attention away from the task of driving to focus on another activity instead; and

**WHEREAS,** in 2015 alone, distracted driving-related crashes resulted in 3,477 deaths and 391,000 injuries on our nation's roads; and

**WHEREAS,** in New Jersey, distracted driving was listed as a contributing circumstance in nearly 750,000 crashes between 2011-2015; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey will participate in the nationwide *Distracted Driving 2018 Crackdown* from April 1-21, 2018 and police officers from the Town of Secaucus will conduct special enforcement patrols targeting distracted drivers. The patrols will consist of roving patrols and fixed checkpoints; and

WHEREAS, the national slogan for the campaign is UDrive. UText. UPay.; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, in the County of Hudson, in the State of New Jersey, that support is given for the submission of a grant application for the Distracted Driving *U Drive. U Text. U Pay.* Campaign and authorizes the Chief of Police to implement the campaign.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that upon award and funding, the Chief of Police or his designee is hereby authorized to execute any other documents or take any other necessary action to effectuate the spirit and intent of this Resolution.

RESOLUTION COMBINING SEVERAL AUTHORIZATIONS OF BONDS INTO A SINGLE ISSUE AND PRESCRIBING THE DETAILS AND BOND FORM THEREOF FOR \$12,585,000 GENERAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS DATED MAY 1, 2018

WHEREAS, the bond ordinances hereinafter described have been duly adopted and it is necessary to provide for the issuance of the bonds authorized by such bond ordinances; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Secaucus, in the County of Hudson, New Jersey (the "Town"), as follows:

Section 1. There shall be issued at this time \$1,676,141 of the bonds authorized pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 2010-39 adopted by the Town Council of said Town on October 12, 2010. The bonds are issued to finance the resurfacing of various roads, the undertaking of improvements to public buildings and property consisting of (i) installation of a vehicle wash system at the Department of Public Works ("DPW") Garage, (ii) demolition of a building on municipal property adjacent to the Washington Hook and Ladder Fire House and undertaking studies for future use of the

site, (iii) installation of lighting for the Riverside Walkway to Paterson Plank Road, (iv) various improvements to Buchmuller Park Pavilion, (v) exterior improvements to the Municipal Government Center, (vi) upgrading the HVAC system at the DPW Garage, (vii) installation of parking meters at various locations and (viii) installation of a traffic light at Wood Avenue, the undertaking of the following recreation improvements: (i) rehabilitation and upgrade of Ivanaski Park and (ii) major upgrades and improvements to various playgrounds, the acquisition of a new rescue fire truck, the acquisition of a Police Desk recording system and computer and an SUV for the use of the Police Department, the acquisition of a packer/recycling truck and various equipment for a loader for the use of the DPW, the acquisition of a street sweeper for the use of the DPW, the undertaking of Town-wide storm sewer improvements, the acquisition of an SUV for the use of the Department of Inspections, and the acquisition of computer system upgrade equipment for the use of various Town departments, offices and agencies, all in, by and for the Town. The average period of usefulness of the several purposes to be financed by such bond ordinance is a period of 10.54 years computed from the date of such bonds.

Section 2. There shall be issued at this time \$820,688 of the bonds authorized pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 2011-19 adopted by the Town Council of said Town on August 23, 2011. The bonds are issued to finance the reconstruction of Shetik Field in,

by and for the Town. The period of usefulness of the purpose to be financed by such bond ordinance is a period of 15 years computed from the date of such bonds.

Section 3. There shall be issued at this time \$394,736 of the bonds authorized pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 2011-23 adopted by the Town Council of said Town on September 27, 2011. The bonds are issued to finance the undertaking of various infrastructure improvements consisting of (i) construction of center islands and curbing in the downtown business district and (ii) resurfacing of various roads in, by and for the Town. The period of usefulness of the purpose to be financed by such bond ordinance is a period of 10 years computed from the date of such bonds.

Section 4. There shall be issued at this time \$1,568,500 of the bonds authorized pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 2012-7 adopted by the Town Council of said Town on March 13, 2012. The bonds are issued to finance the resurfacing of various roads, the undertaking of various storm sewer and flood mitigation improvements, including increasing the piping capacity to the Golden Avenue Storm Sewer Pumping Station, the undertaking of improvements to various parks, the undertaking of the following improvements to the Ice Rink: (i) resurfacing the rink floor, (ii) installation of a new scoreboard and (iii) installation of a new sound system, the replacement of the generator at the High School

Pumping Station on Ridge Road, the supplemental funding for the acquisition of a new fire rescue truck, the upgrading and retrofitting of air packs with wands and computers for the use of the Fire Department, the acquisition of mason trucks, a mechanic's truck, a dump truck with plow and spreader, pickup trucks and a van for the use of the DPW, the acquisition of a pickup truck for the use of the Office of Emergency Management ("OEM"), the acquisition of an SUV for the use of the Police Department, the acquisition of radios for the use of the Police Department, and the acquisition of computer system upgrade equipment for the use of various Town departments, offices and agencies, all in, by and for the Town. The average period of usefulness of the several purposes to be financed by such bond ordinance is a period of 18.18 years computed from the date of such bonds.

Section 5. There shall be issued at this time \$377,228 of the bonds authorized pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 2012-25 adopted by the Town Council of said Town on July 24, 2012. The bonds are issued to finance the undertaking of the Municipal Buildings Voice and Data Communications Systems Project in, by and for the Town. The period of usefulness of the purpose to be financed by such bond ordinance is a period of 7 years computed from the date of such bonds.

Section 6. There shall be issued at this time \$508,297 of the bonds authorized pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 2012-34

adopted by the Town Council of said Town on October 23, 2012. The bonds are issued to finance the undertaking of various improvements to parks and the supplemental funding for the acquisition of a new fire rescue truck, all in, by and for the Town. The average period of usefulness of the several purposes to be financed by such bond ordinance is a period of 14.16 years computed from the date of such bonds.

Section 7. There shall be issued at this time \$2,954,500 of the bonds authorized pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 2013-6  $\,$ adopted by the Town Council of said Town on March 26, 2013. bonds are issued to finance the undertaking of an engineering study for the installation of a traffic light at the intersection of Meadowlands Parkway and Wood Avenue and resurfacing of various roads, the undertaking of renovations of, and construction of an addition to, the County Avenue Fire House, the undertaking of improvements to various parks and playgrounds, the undertaking of the engineering and preliminary construction phases of the rehabilitation of the DPW Garage, the installation of handicappedaccess doors at, and acquisition of treadmills for, the Recreation Center, the partial funding for the acquisition of a new tower ladder fire truck, the acquisition of turnout gear for the use of the Fire Department, the acquisition of a recycling/garbage truck with snow plow and medical escort van for the use of the DPW, an SUV and pickup truck for the use of the Fire Department, a van for

the use of Recreation and an SUV for the use of Senior Services, the acquisition of radio equipment for Federally-mandated narrow band compliance and vehicle diagnostic system equipment for the use of the DPW, the acquisition of computer equipment, defibrillators and a pickup truck for the use of the Police Department, the acquisition of a security monitoring system for public buildings and property, portable radios for the use of the Police Department and various radio equipment for the use of the OEM, supplemental funding for the Municipal Buildings Voice and Data Communications Systems Project, and the acquisition of computer system upgrade equipment for the use of various Town departments, offices and agencies, all in, by and for the Town. The average period of usefulness of the several purposes to be financed by such bond ordinance is a period of 11.96 years computed from the date of such bonds.

Section 8. There shall be issued at this time \$2,609,900 of the bonds authorized pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 2014-8 adopted by the Town Council of said Town on April 22, 2014. The bonds are issued to finance the installation of a traffic light at the intersection of Meadowlands Parkway and Wood Avenue and resurfacing of various roads, the undertaking of the following improvements to public property: (i) construction of a gable roof/addition to Engine No. 3 Fire House, (ii) replacement of the floor at the DPW Garage and (iii) installation of storage sheds at

various Fire Houses, the undertaking of various storm sewer and flood mitigation improvements, the installation of a generator at the Library/OEM, the installation of a security camera system at Buchmuller Park, the partial funding for the acquisition of a new tower ladder fire truck, the acquisition of turnout gear, fire hose, air pack upgrades, swiftwater rescue equipment, an equipment shed and an SUV for the use of the Fire Department, the acquisition of a roll-off container truck with containers, snow plow and salt spreader, pickup truck (chassis only), mason dump trucks, multipurpose field machine/mini snow plow, pickup truck with enclosed cab and a small SUV for the use of the DPW and a van for the use of the IT Department, the acquisition of upgraded sign making equipment and a line painting machine for the use of the DPW, the acquisition of upgraded sound equipment for use in Council Chambers No. 2 and Channel 36 TV equipment, and the acquisition of computer system and communications upgrade equipment for the use of various Town departments, offices and agencies, all in, by and for the Town. The average period of usefulness of the several purposes to be financed by such bond ordinance is a period of 12.54 years computed from the date of such bonds.

Section 9. There shall be issued at this time \$723,010 of the bonds authorized pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 2014-10 adopted by the Town Council of said Town on April 22, 2014. The bonds are issued to finance the renovation of the Ice Rink and the

acquisition of a zamboni machine for use therein in, by and for the Town. The period of usefulness of the purpose to be financed by such bond ordinance is a period of 15 years computed from the date of such bonds.

Section 10. There shall be issued at this time \$952,000 of the bonds authorized pursuant to Bond Ordinance No. 2016-22 adopted by the Town Council of said Town on September 13, 2016. The bonds are issued to finance the undertaking of improvements to Meadowlands Parkway consisting of road resurfacing and construction of a bike path and resurfacing of various roads, and the undertaking of various improvements to public buildings, all in, by and for the Town. The average period of usefulness of the several purposes to be financed by such bond ordinance is a period of 11.25 years computed from the date of such bonds.

Section 11. The bonds authorized by said ten bond ordinances described in Sections 1 to 10, inclusive, of this resolution shall be issued as a single issue of bonds, aggregating \$12,585,000 consisting of an issue of bonds of the denomination of \$5,000 each or any integral multiple thereof, numbered in the order of their maturity. In the event that the purchaser of the bonds elects to take bonds in the last maturity which are not in multiples of \$5,000, or, if there are any such bonds herein, such bonds shall be in the denomination of \$1,000 or any integral multiple thereof, numbered upwards from the last numbered \$5,000

bond. The average period of usefulness within which the bonds authorized by said ten bond ordinances mature, according to the respective reasonable lives of the purposes to be financed, as determined in said ordinances taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds authorized for the purposes to be financed as set forth in each of the bond ordinances hereinbefore set forth, is a period of 12.86 years computed from the date of such bonds. Said issue shall be payable in annual installments on May 1 in each year as follows:

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$700,000 in the year 2019,

$730,000 in the year 2020,

$750,000 in the year 2021,

$780,000 in the year 2022,

$850,000 in the year 2023,

$900,000 in the year 2024,

$1,150,000 in the year 2025,

$1,200,000 in the year 2026,

$1,325,000 in the year 2027, and

$1,400,000 in each of the years 2028 to 2030, inclusive.
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Said bonds shall be designated "General Improvement Bonds". A portion of the indebtedness evidenced by each such bond shall be deemed to have been incurred for the purpose described in each bond ordinance authorizing bonds of the same maturity, and such portion of such indebtedness shall be in the same proportion to the principal amount of such bonds as the total amount of bonds of like maturity to be issued pursuant to such bond ordinance bears to the aggregate amount of bonds of like maturity to be issued pursuant to such ten bond ordinances.

Section 12. All of said bonds shall be dated May 1, 2018, and shall bear interest from their date until their respective maturities at the rates per annum named in the proposal accepted. Such rates of interest shall be determined at the time said bonds are sold. Such interest shall be payable on each May 1 and November 1, commencing November 1, 2018 (each, an "Interest Payment Date"), in each year until maturity or prior redemption.

Section 13. The bonds maturing on or before May 1, 2025 are not subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities. The bonds maturing on or after May 1, 2026 are subject to redemption at the option of the Town prior to maturity, in whole on any date or in part on any Interest Payment Date, on or after May 1, 2025, upon notice as hereinafter set forth at the redemption price of 100% of the principal amount being redeemed, plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

If the Town determines to optionally redeem a portion of the bonds prior to maturity, such bonds so redeemed shall be in such maturities as determined by the Town, and within any maturity, by lot; provided, however, that the portion of any bond to be redeemed shall be in the principal amount of \$5,000 or some multiple thereof and that, in selecting bonds for redemption, the Bond Registrar/Paying Agent (as hereinafter defined) shall treat each bond as representing that number of bonds that is obtained by dividing the principal amount of such bond by \$5,000.

Section 14. Notice of redemption shall be given by first class mail in a sealed envelope with postage prepaid to the registered owners of the bonds at their respective addresses as they last appear on the registration books kept for that purpose by the Bond Registrar/Paying Agent at least thirty (30) but not more than sixty (60) days before the date fixed for redemption. Such mailing is not a condition precedent to redemption, and the failure to mail or to receive any redemption notice will not affect the validity of the redemption proceedings. If any bond subject to redemption is a part of a greater principal amount of the bonds not to be redeemed, such entire amount shall be surrendered to the Bond Registrar/Paying Agent and, for that portion of the bond not to be redeemed, a new bond shall be issued in the name of the registered owner in an amount equal to the principal amount of the bond surrendered less the amount to be redeemed.

Section 15. The bonds will be issued in fully registered form by means of a book-entry system with no physical distribution of bond certificates made to the public. One bond certificate for each maturity will be issued to The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York ("DTC"), and immobilized in its custody. The bookentry system will evidence ownership of the bonds in principal amounts of \$5,000 or integral multiples thereof, with transfers of beneficial ownership effected on the records of DTC and its participants pursuant to rules and procedures established by DTC.

Interest on the bonds will be payable at the times stated in Section 12 of this resolution, and principal of the bonds will be paid annually on May 1, as set forth in the maturity schedule hereinbefore stated, in immediately available funds to DTC or its nominee as registered owner of the bonds. Transfer of principal and interest payments to participants of DTC will be the responsibility of such participants and other nominees of beneficial owners. Interest will be payable to owners of bonds shown on the records of DTC as of the fifteenth day of the month preceding the month in which such interest payment date occurs. The Town will not be responsible or liable for maintaining, supervising or reviewing the records maintained by DTC, its participants or persons acting through such participants.

In the event that (a) DTC determines not to continue to act as securities depository for the bonds, or (b) the Town determines that continuation of the book-entry system of evidence and transfer of ownership of the bonds would adversely affect the interests of the beneficial owners of the bonds, the Town will discontinue the book-entry system with DTC. If the Town fails to identify another qualified securities depository to replace DTC, the Town will authenticate and deliver replacement bonds in the form of fully registered certificates.

The principal of and the interest on the bonds shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America

which is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts on the respective dates of payment thereof.

Section 16. The Chief Financial Officer, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-34, is hereby authorized to sell and award the bonds in accordance with the terms of the notice of sale, such terms to be determined by a resolution of the Town Council to be hereafter adopted. The bonds will be authenticated by the manual signature of the Bond Registrar/Paying Agent.
