### AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS, COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY

### ORDINANCE NO. 2021-27

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 12 OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS ENTITLED "FIRE DEPARTMENT" TO UPDATE ELECTION TIMING

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council recognize that the safety of all residents and the protection of buildings and structures is of utmost concern and that the ability to provide emergency fire services is critical to the protection of the public; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Secaucus' Volunteer Fire Department serves the fire and emergency response needs of the municipality and is governed by T.O. 12-1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, updates are recommended by the Fire Chiefs and the Secaucus Volunteer Fire Department Mutual Association as to election timing for the Fire Department to allow for a timely process and adequate transition period.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, County of Hudson, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. Chapter 12 of Code of the Town of Secaucus, "§12-4. Terms of office; election of Battalion Chief; office of Fire Chief and Deputy Chief." be, and is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows: (deletions are indicated by erossouts; additions are indicated in **bold**):

В.

- A.

  The term of Fire Chief, Deputy Chief, and Battalion Chief shall each be for two (2) years, and shall commence as of January 1st of each year.
- 1. The Battalion Chief, who, in order to qualify must have served as Captain of his respective company for at least two years, shall be elected for a two (2) year term by ballot of the members of the Fire Department. Such Battalion Chief shall be elected from that company where it is designated by order of rotation to have such Battalion Chief elected. The order of rotation is as follows: first from Engine Company No. 1, then from Engine Company No. 3, then Engine Company No.

2. Nominations for Battalion Chief shall be made in October of the appropriate year, with a deadline of October 31. The election shall be conducted in December-November, prior to December 22nd November 30 between the hours

**2/Rescue No. 1,** then Hose Company Tower No. 2, and then Truck Company No. 1/Engine Company No. 4 (no preference is implied by this order of rotation).

of 7:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. at the firehouse from where the new Battalion Chief is to be elected, and one member of each company selected by such company shall act as an inspector of such election; one inspector shall be designated the head of the election committee. Said inspectors shall supervise the election, by secret ballot, and shall thereupon proceed to take the votes of the Department; the person receiving the greatest number of votes for Battalion Chief shall be declared elected, subject to the approval of the Mayor and Council, and the head of the committee shall report the results to the Mayor and Council at the first meeting thereafter. Such person shall be confirmed by the Mayor and Council, or the Mayor and Council may choose, for good cause, not to confirm such person whereupon a new election shall be held. The filing of absentee ballots from all members of the Fire Department who are unable to vote in person at such election shall be permitted, provided that such absentee ballots are received prior to such election; the Fire Chief may establish such rules and regulations as may be necessary to effectuate such absentee ballot voting procedure.

The election date shall be selected by the Mayor and Council Secaucus Volunteer Fire Department Mutual Association in consultation with the three (3) chiefs, and who the Secaucus Volunteer Fire Department Mutual Association shall provide written notice to the senior officer for each firehouse at least fourteen (14) days prior to the election. Written notice of the election shall be prominently posted at each firehouse at least ten (10) days prior to the election. Nomination and election dates may be changed for cause by the Fire Chief upon approval of the Mayor and Council.

C.

At the expiration of the term of the Fire Chief, the Deputy Chief shall become the Chief. After the expiration of the term of the Deputy Chief, the Battalion Chief shall become the Deputy Chief.

- 2. There are no other changes to this Chapter of the Code of the Town of Secaucus.
- 3. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.
- 4. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to that section, subdivision, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be valid and effective.
- 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-28

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 127-58B OF THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF SECAUCUS ENTITLED "DESIGNATION OF LOCATIONS AT OR NEAR PRIVATE RESIDENCES"

### SECTION 1

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus that Section 127-58B - "Designation of Locations at or Near Private Residences" shall be amended by <u>adding</u> the following location:

NAME OF STREET	SIDE	LOCATION
Born Street	South	On the south side of Born Street, beginning at a point 209 feet west of the southwest corner of Paterson Plank Road and Born Street continuing west for a distance of 20 feet in front of 255 Born Street

That the parking space designated for 255 Born Street adopted by Ordinance is to be personalized for Placard Number P2375120.

If the license plate(s) for the person(s) utilizing the parking Space(s) at the above listed address(es) changes, then the parking space designation shall be changed to the new plate with proof from the resident that it is for the same person that the person is still entitled to handicapped parking.

### SECTION 2

### SEVERABILITY

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the provisions of this ordinance are separable and if any provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part thereof is held illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional, or inapplicable to any person or circumstance, such illegality, invalidity or unconstitutionality, or inapplicability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, clauses, sentences, subsections, words, or parts of the

regulation or their application to other persons or circumstances. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this ordinance would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part had not been included therein, and if such persons or circumstances, to which the ordinance or part thereof is held inapplicable, had been specifically exempted therefrom.

### SECTION 3

#### REPEALER

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that all other ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed, to the extent of such inconsistency.

### SECTION 4

### EFFECTIVE DATE

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as provided by law.

WHEREAS, the Town of Secaucus sets forth various employee policies in its Town of Secaucus Employee Handbook and said policies may be revised as deemed necessary by Administration as needed; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to revise the portion of policy entitled "Donated Leave" to specify requirements and process.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Secaucus, County of Hudson, State of New Jersey, that the Donated Leave policy section of the Town of Secaucus Employee Handbook be revised and the Donated Leave policy as attached is hereby adopted; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** the revised policy portion takes precedence over any other policy previously established or adopted and shall be deemed in effect as of this date; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Town Administrator, Human Resources Director or their designee is hereby authorized to take any action necessary to effectuate the spirit and purpose of this Resolution.

### **PURPOSE**

The intent of this policy is to permit full-time employees of the Town of Secaucus to voluntarily donate whole sick or vacation days to eligible co-workers who have exhausted all of their accrued paid time off (vacation/sick/personal/compensatory) due to a severe illness or injury that necessitates the employee's prolonged absence from work.

Employees who use donated leave will be treated for all purposes as if they were using their own sick leave and will continue to receive their full salary while they are on donated leave.

#### **SCOPE**

This policy applies to all full-time Town employees at all locations.

### RESPONSIBILITY

All full-time employees requesting donated leave must do so in accordance with the provisions set forth within this policy.

The interpretation and administration of this policy shall be the responsibility of the Human Resources Department and the Town Administrator.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

### A. Recipient:

An employee must meet the following criteria to be considered to receive donated leave:

- 1. The employee must have completed at least one (1) year of continuous service with the Town of Secaucus.
- 2. The employee must have a serious health condition or injury that requires a prolonged absence from work on a continuous or intermittent basis for which the employee has no available paid time off.
- 3. The employee must exhaust all their earned paid time off, including sick, vacation, personal days and any other available time.
- 4. The employee or the employee's supervisor shall make a request to the Town Administrator for their participation in the program as a leave

recipient.

- 5. The Town Administrator and/or their designee may approve the employee's participation in the program, as a leave recipient or leave donor.
- 6. An employee must receive at least five (5) donated days to participate and the maximum days that can be received in total is 247 days.
- 7. Donated days cannot be used retroactively.

### B. Donor:

To be eligible to donate sick or vacation days to another full-time employee, a donor must meet the following criteria:

- 1. The donor must be a current employee of the Town of Secaucus.
- 2. The donor may donate up to fen (10) days within a calendar year to any one recipient.
- 3. The donor must have at least twenty (20) days of accrued sick leave left after any donation and at least twelve (12) days of accrued vacation days if donating vacation days.
- 4. A donor cannot revoke the leave donations once given.



### **REQUIREMENTS:**

- A. Medical documentation is required from one or more physicians or other appropriate experts confirming ongoing treatment and anticipated duration of the medical leave. Any documentation will be provided directly to Human Resources. The Town reserves the right to ask for additional documentation as may be needed to substantiate the ongoing leave.
- B. When the employee's request for donated leave is approved, the Benefits Coordinator, with the consent of the employee, may circulate the recipient employee's name to other employees with a request for donated days.
- C. The Town will provide notice to the appropriate Union representative, if applicable. If the employee is unable to consent to the circulation, the employee's legal representative may consent on their behalf.
- D. Donated days must be given only in whole sick and vacation days.
- E. Should an employee return to work or terminate employment with donated time remaining, that time will be returned to the donor(s) on a prorated basis. However, if the proration of leave days results in less than one-half day per donor to be returned, the remaining leave time will be removed from the employee recipients PTO and transferred to a "donated time bank" to be maintained by the Town for use of future eligible recipients.
- F. The recipient employee, while using donated leave, will continue to earn sick, personal and vacation leave. Earned sick, personal and vacation leave that accumulates must be used before donated leave. Once the employee's accrued PTO is completely exhausted, they may then revert back to the use of donated leave days.
- G. The recipient employee will not be granted supplemental compensation or retirement for any unused sick, vacation or personal days, which they had received through the donated leave program.



- H. The receipt of donated leave will not preclude the Town from filing disciplinary actions for chronic or excessive absenteeism or other disciplinary actions, if applicable.
- I. If a recipient employee's absence will extend beyond the 247 days donated leave time, the employee may make application for a leave of absence, without pay, in accordance with all Town, State and Federal requirements and procedures.
- J. This program may be discontinued or amended at any time by the Town of Secaucus at the Towns' sole discretion.
- K. This program shall not be utilized to assist an employee who requires leave time to care for a family member.

### **PROCEDURE**

### A. Recipient:

Employees (full time) seeking donated leave must complete and sign a Donated Leave Request Form.

### B. Donor:

Employees seeking to donate leave must complete and sign a Donor Transfer Form.

### C. Approval:

No transfer of leave time is authorized unless approved in writing by the Town Administrator and or his designate.

- 1. FACILITY. The Town agrees to rent lanes of the Secaucus Recreation Center Indoor Pool located at 1200 Koelle Boulevard, Town of Secaucus, New Jersey (hereinafter "Facility") to JFAC for the date, time period and event described below for an cight (8) month term from October 1, 2021 through May 31, 2022.
- 2. DATE and TERM. The Facility will be used by the Renter for the following Rental Periods. Certain adjustments as noted below may need to be made in the interest of facility utilization:

Any additional dates or requests shall be made in writing to the Department of Recreation.

- 3. EVENT/ACTIVITIES. Renter will be responsible for, and liable to, the Town for all damages, repairs or extraordinary cleaning to the Facility required as a result of Renter and/or Renter's guests, agents, employees, participants, vendors/performers, invitees or attendees.
- 6. OCCUPANCY. Occupancy shall be within posted facility limits and shall be in accordance with current Governor's Executive Orders, Department of Health Regulations, Secaucus Swim Club policy and USA swimming regulations. Only team members and coaches shall be allowed in the facility.
- 7. SMOKING. Smoking is prohibited at all Facilities.
- 8. INSURANCE. Renter agrees to procure and maintain at their sole cost and expense any insurance required by the Town of Secaucus and present a copy of such to the Town of Secaucus prior to the use.
- 9. INDEMIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS. Renter agrees to indemnify and hold the Town, its officers, agents, and employees harmless from any loss or liability which may result from claims of injury to persons or property from any cause arising out of or during the use and occupancy of the Facility by Renter and Renter's guests, agents, employees, participants, vendors/performers, invitees or attendees.

This Waiver of Claim includes the use of any equipment, building, or part of building, facilities and services, and grounds which is owned or leased by the Town which is being used on a rental, concession, contract, or gratis basis, and the risk of all current conditions existing in the facility, building, grounds and the area surrounding such is assumed by the Renter.

Renter shall ensure that all guests, attendees and participants sign any required information sheets and releases required by the Recreation Department, or rental privileges may be revoked. Renter agrees that they are fully responsible for the actions and behavior of all guests, attendees and participants.

- 10. ASSIGNMENT. This Rental Agreement is not assignable to any other person or entity.
- 11. CANCELLATION. This Agreement may be cancelled by either party if provided in writing upon sixty (60) days' notice.

Regarding each time slot/period, the monthly fee shall not be reduced or refunded if use by Renter does not occur due to Renter's cancellation or discretion not to utilize any particular slot/period for any reason.

In the event that the Town is unable to fulfill its obligation due to damage or destruction of the Facility, acts or regulations of public authorities, weather events (including but not limited to snow, thunder or lightning), civil tumult, strike, power outage or any unforeseen occurrence rendering the Facility not useable; the Town shall not be held legally responsible for any damages arising from the cancellation of the Facility rental listed herein. However, the Town will agree to take steps to provide alternate time for use or, if not possible, to partially refund a pro-rated amount of the fee based on the length of the rental if such occurs due to the above reasons during the Facility rental period.

- 13. RIGHT OF ENTRY AND TERMINATION. The Town, its officers, agents, and employees shall have the right to enter the Facility at all times during the Event to confirm Renter's conformance to this Agreement. If the Town determines, in its sole judgment, that Renter has breached a term of this Agreement, the Town shall have the right to immediately terminate this Rental Agreement prior to the expiration of its term and prior to the conclusion of the Event without any refund to Renter.
- 14. ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS. In order to facilitate use of the Secaucus Recreation Center Pool and to ensure a safe and healthy environment for all concerned, the following conditions of use must be adhered to:
  - a) An authorized USA Swimming Coach and Recreation Center Lifeguard must be on deck at all times when the pool is being used by JFAC. Certification must be in accordance with USA Swimming regulations. Proof of current Certifications for all coaches must be on file with the Secaucus Recreation Director or their designee.
  - b) ONLY JFAC members and coaches are permitted to enter the facility. JFAC shall provide a full roster with emergency contact information. Members may not enter until the coach is present and supervising the program. Entry shall not be more than fifteen (15) minutes prior to a scheduled practice or time slot.
  - c) JFAC members are encouraged to bring their own locks for the daily use lockers. All items and locks shall be removed by members at the end of practice.
  - d) JFAC shall be responsible for complete cleanup of the locker rooms and pool deck associated with use. All equipment is to be put away after each practice in the designated storage areas. JFAC coach or staff must inspect the deck and locker rooms after each session prior to departing the facility.
  - e) All Secaucus Recreation Center pool rules must be followed by all. Coaching staff is responsible for enforcing all pool and locker room rules. All fire and life safety guidelines must be observed.

- f) JFAC members, family members and spectators shall be supervised at all times by JFAC staff while inside the pool and pool area. Coaching staff must remain inside the pool area until all participants have exited.
- g) JFAC coaches are responsible for all team members to be picked up before leaving the facility.
- h) Children must be supervised at all times and must remain in the designated Facility rental area. Children should not be dropped off and left unattended on the premises. Children should only be on premises with a guardian, responsible adult or a coach/JFAC staff.
- i) Glass bottles and alcohol are not permitted at the Secaucus Recreation Center Pool at any time.
- j) Diving in water less than seven (7) feet is prohibited at all times.
- k) All garbage and recyclables must be placed in the proper containers that are provided in the Facility.
- JFAC is responsible for the cost of any additional maintenance/custodial service required due to damage or excessive clean up resulting from JFAC use.
- m) JFAC acknowledges that the facility will not be available for use by them on weekend dates when the Secaucus Recreation Center Pool is rented out for a prior event.
- n) JFAC is not permitted to use any other parts of the facility for any practice unless a prior agreement between the Town of Secaucus (Secaucus Recreation Center) and JFAC is in place. Cost shall be in accordance with the Town's facility rental fees on file with the Town Clerk. A minimum of twenty-four (24) hours advance notice shall be given.
- o) Secaucus Recreation Center shall not be held responsible for lost or stolen articles.
- p) All COVID-19 state, federal and local guidelines shall be followed. This includes:
  - Social distancing practices in the facility is required. For swim teams, all practices must be in accordance with USA Swimming social distancing practice layouts.
  - o All members and coaches must be informed not to enter the Recreation Center if experiencing any of these symptoms: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting and/or diarrhea.
  - o If masks are required in the facility, JFAC will be responsible for ensuring all members and coaches have masks/face coverings and will provide in the event a member or coach does not have one.
  - No masks are permitted when swimming in any pool.
